INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Woonona High School is a vibrant and innovative, proudly comprehensive high school that values strong community partnerships. Student success is driven by excellence in teaching and learning delivered by world class educators in a safe and supportive learning environment. Our students are confident, creative individuals who enrich our local and global community.

The introduction of a highly successful Enrichment Class for our most able students in Year 7 has led to the implementation of enrichment classes in all core classes Years 8 - 10. Students, teachers and parents involved have commended the initiative and feel that it has made a difference to the learning of the students. In 2016, our school decided to introduce another enrichment initiative to run parallel to the existing enrichment class - the CAPA Enrichment Class.

Our school welcomes applications from students who are eligible to attend Woonona High School.

As outlined in the department's enrolment policy, our school may accept enrolments from outside our local enrolment area if places are available. Students who reside outside of the designated intake area for Woonona High School are subject to a set of criteria for non-local enrolments as outlined in our Enrolment Policy and Procedures. A copy of this document is available from our Front Office upon request. We will assess applications for non-local enrolment on a case-by-case basis against the criteria.

This document contains all the information regarding the application process. We are confident that this program of study and the academic and creative environment at Woonona High School will foster your child's talents and open the door for them to achieve their very best.

THE CAPA ENRICHMENT CLASS PROGRAM

The CAPA Enrichment Class is designed for students with an interest and talent in the Creative and Performing Arts. The goal being to provide students with a holistic CAPA experience that fosters their abilities, creativity and collaboration within and across each discipline of the arts. Whilst this program provides students with all the core subjects needed to fulfil the requirements of Year 7 at high school, they benefit from additional teaching time in the Creative and Performing Arts encompassing the NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA) *Dance, Drama, Music* and *Visual Arts* syllabus content. All students at Woonona High School are offered a large range of CAPA extra and co-curricular opportunities and from Year 8-12, students can choose to study a wide variety of CAPA electives including HSC Dance, Drama, Music and Art.

THE PROCESS

Applications for the CAPA Enrichment Class are due to the Woonona High School office by **Friday 26 March**. All students applying for the CAPA Enrichment Class will be invited to a **Workshop on Tuesday 30 March**. The fun workshops run on this day are designed to observe students' ability in their chosen discipline and their ability to work creatively and collaboratively with their peers, within and across the CAPA disciplines.

Applications must include;

- Completed application form
- Student's Year 5 NAPLAN results
- Tutor / Teacher report
- ❖ A non-refundable application fee of \$30. Payments can be made online or by card, cash or cheque.

Workshop requirements – (if Covid restrictions allow):

- All students are required to attend a workshop on Tuesday 30 March from 9:00-11:00am.
- Please wear appropriate attire (see below). Music students should bring their instruments.

Individual audition requirements (video/email)

Circus/Dance/Drama/Music General Requirements:

• Students are to prepare and film an audition piece of up to a maximum of **two minutes duration**. Videos of auditions will be stopped after two minutes.

Circus - Specific Requirements

• Students must submit a recent video recording of them performing (of up to two minutes duration). Students can choose to attend either the Dance or Drama workshop.

Dance - Specific Requirements

 Students are to wear appropriate dance attire in their video and to the workshop: leotard/tights or unitard with hair tied back from face. No makeup or costume required.
 Soft jazz shoes or ballet shoes can be work in the workshop but are not required.

Drama - Specific Requirements:

- Students must present a prepared monologue (see examples attached or own choice).
- Students are to wear appropriate performance attire with hair tied back from face in their video and to the workshop. No makeup or costume required.

Music - Specific Requirements:

- Students may have live accompaniment or use backing track if needed in their video.
- Please ensure the relevant part is removed (e.g. vocalists must use an instrumental or karaoke version). Students are to wear appropriate attire in their video and to the workshop.

Visual Arts - Specific Requirements:

• Students must **email** a digital copy of 4-6 examples of recent artworks. These may include drawings, paintings, prints, photographs, 3D artworks or films.
