Principal's Report

This morning I had the pleasure of meeting and speaking with our incoming Year 7, 2012 students and parents. Ms Packer and I are very much looking forward to sharing the achievements and successes of the incoming students over the next six years. I also look forward to building positive relationships with the parents of Year 6 students. It was terrific to speak with so many enthusiastic, supportive parents of Woonona High School.

Parents of Year 9 students would / should have received a letter inviting them to a brief meeting next Thursday evening in the school hall at 7.00pm. The purpose of the meeting is to present to parents and students an initiative that we are exploring for Year 10 students 2012. Students in Year 10, 2012 and beyond will no longer sit the external School Certificate examinations. Woonona High School has had great success in developing alternative programs previously. We see this as another opportunity to evaluate, modify and propose a different model of teaching and learning practices to ensure that we are maximising opportunities for students in their transition from Woonona High to further education, employment or training.

The Junior Girls' water polo team have been successful at local and regional level and next Monday and Tuesday they will compete in the state championships at Raymond Terrace. Not only are the girls excited about competing at state level they are very much looking forward to representing the school in a professional swimming team costume. I would like to thank Mr & Mrs Brown for their very generous sponsorship of the team and despite the outcome of the competition our girls will look great!

It always gives me great pleasure to be able to share with the school community the achievements of our students. However, there are also times when I will have to alert the community to concerns that I have regarding students, safety, incidents or compliance with school policy and procedures.

In recent weeks the senior executive have had to spend an inordinate amount of time dealing with students who have not complied with the school's Electronic Communication Devices Policy and in some instances the students have breeched Telecommunications Legislation. Behaviours have included the theft of a mobile phone and ipod, harassment via facebook (whilst at school), recording of aggressive behaviour and the uploading of inappropriate images to Youtube. Staff have also raised a number of concerns regarding students inappropriate use of mobile phones in the classroom, at sport and on excursions. Inappropriate and excessive use of mobile phones whilst at school was also raised as an issue by parents at a recent P&C meeting. In response I am undertaking a review of the current policy and associated procedures. Students have been informed of the review, staff have been consulted and asked to propose amendments to the current policy and parents will be consulted via P&C and the proposed policy being available on the school website for comment. I anticipate amendments or changes to the current policy to be ready for implementation in 2012.

Year 6 students and parents this morning had the opportunity to order and pay for uniforms for 2012. Year 10 students and parents will be able to try on, order and pay for senior uniforms 2012 each morning next week in the foyer of the school hall. Parents from the P&C uniform committee will be available each morning next week with uniform order sheets and uniform samples. Payment can be made at the front office at the time of order or on receipt of the order early 2012.

Vaccinations

Each year NSW Public Health Units offer the vaccines recommended by the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC) for adolescents as part of the school-based program.

In 2012 the following vaccines will be offered:

- Hepatitis B will be offered in a catch-up program for all Year 7 students who have not already been vaccinated with 3 doses of hepatitis B vaccine when they were a baby/younger child.
- Varicella (chickenpox) vaccines will be offered in a catch-up program for all Year
 7 students who have not already been vaccinated or had chickenpox disease.
- Human Papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine will be offered to Year 7 girls as a 3-dose course.
- Diptheria, Tetanus & Pertussis (Whooping Cough) will be offered to all Year 7 and Year 10 students.
