




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Excellence Innovation Success

This week students have been enjoying a range of interesting and fun activities.


In-school activities included a handball competition, computer games, table tennis, art and Italian cookery classes, as well as decoration and card making, board games, movies and indoor soccer.

The competition judges from Illawarra Mercury congratulated our school on consistently having such a high standard of entries each year.



We have had a jam-packed year but have showed a smile throughout all our activities. We can't wait till next year.


