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## Remembrance Day Assembly

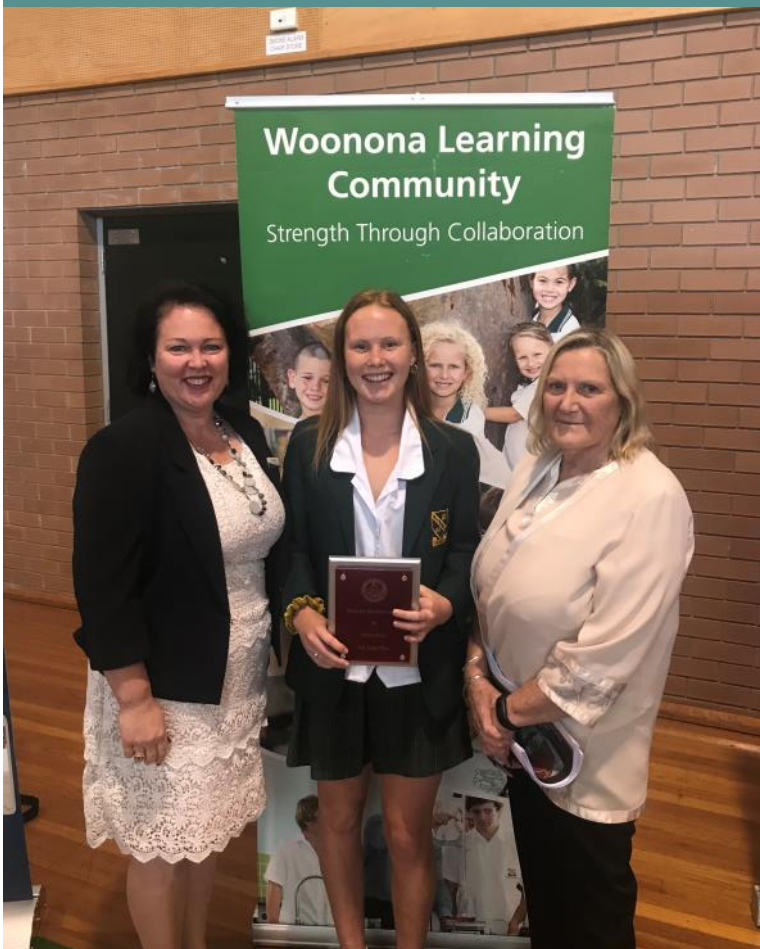

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# FIRST Lego League Competition

On the 11<sup>th</sup> of November, 2018, 31 groups of aspiring STEM students assembled at The Illawarra Grammar School (TIGS) for a regional *FIRST Lego League* competition. After 2 months of robot-building, core values and researching, the groups came to prove their mettle in a high-energy environment. In the end, 6 teams qualified to the state competition, being held on Saturday.

One of these teams, the Gong Invaders, included Year 10 student and all-around cool guy Aiden Checklin. He and the rest of his team walked away with the Champion's Award, the highest award possible. They hope to qualify for the national championship in Sydney on the 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> of December.

*FIRST* was founded in 1989 to inspire young people's interest and participation in science and technology. Based in New Hampshire, USA, the 501 (c) (3) not-for-profit public charity designs accessible, innovative programs that motivate young people to pursue education and career opportunities in science, technology, engineering, and math, while building self-confidence, knowledge, and life skills.

The *FIRST Lego League* is an international competition, involving 98 countries and 40,000 teams. This year is the 30<sup>th</sup> season, which celebrates all things space, called Into Orbit. During the INTO ORBIT season, teams will choose and solve a real-world problem in the Project. They will also build, test, and program an autonomous robot using LEGO® MINDSTORMS® technology to solve a set of missions in the Robot Game.

Aiden, along with his brother and 3 other students (aka The Gong Invaders) were judged not only on the performance of their robot that they built and programmed but also on a project that they presented as well as their "core values". While their robot did not perform at its best on the day, their consistent excellence across the other judging criteria resulted in them winning 1<sup>st</sup> place overall and were awarded the "Champions Award".

They now move on to compete at the NSW State Competition, to be held at St Mary Star of the Sea College, Wollongong on 24 November. Fantastic achievement Aiden!

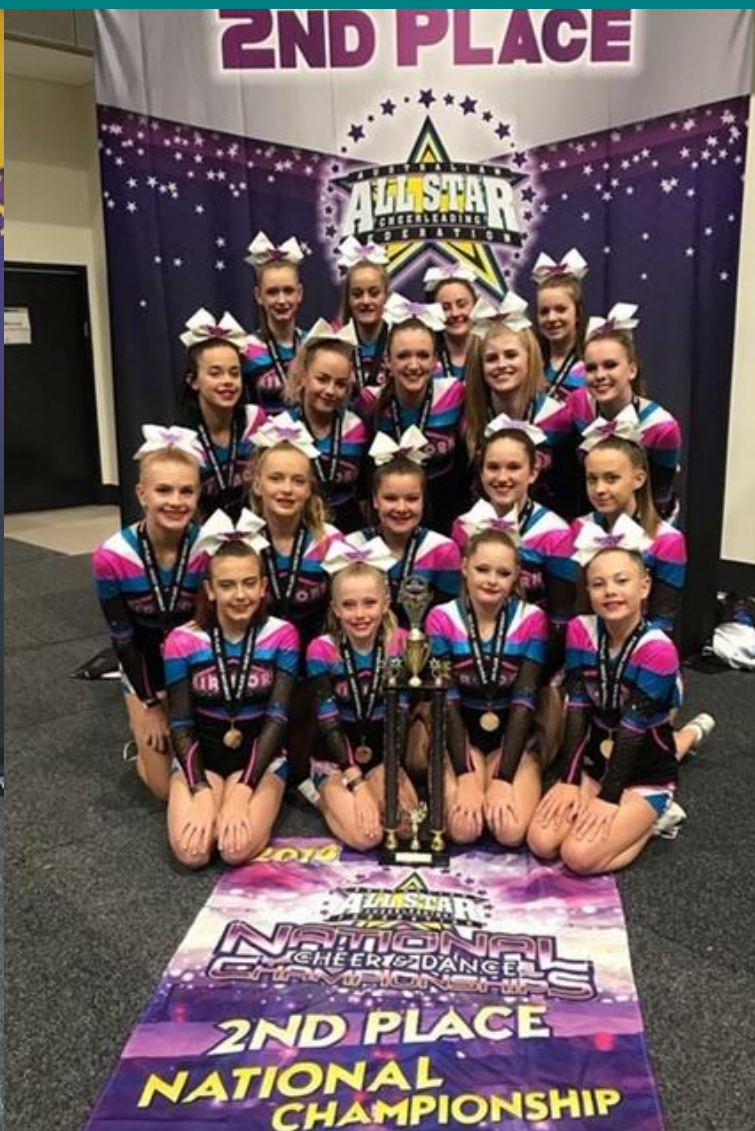
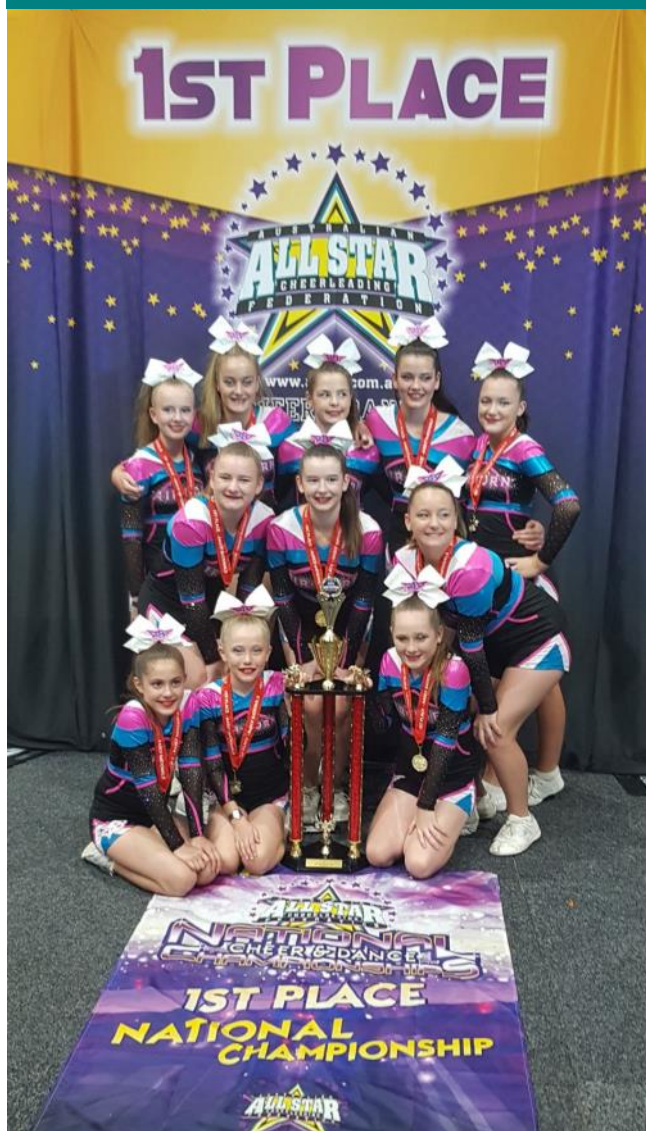

1<sup>st</sup> place - National Champs– Level 2 Cheerleading – X Factor – Ava Ramsey and Charlotte Jones

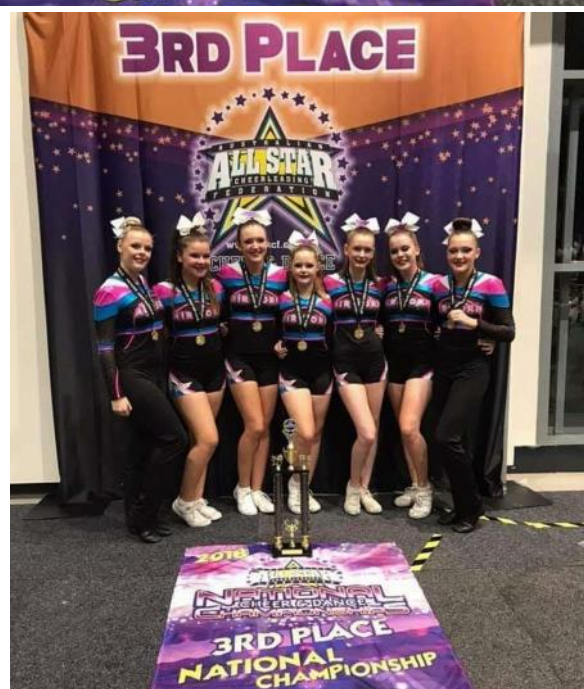

# End of Year Activities

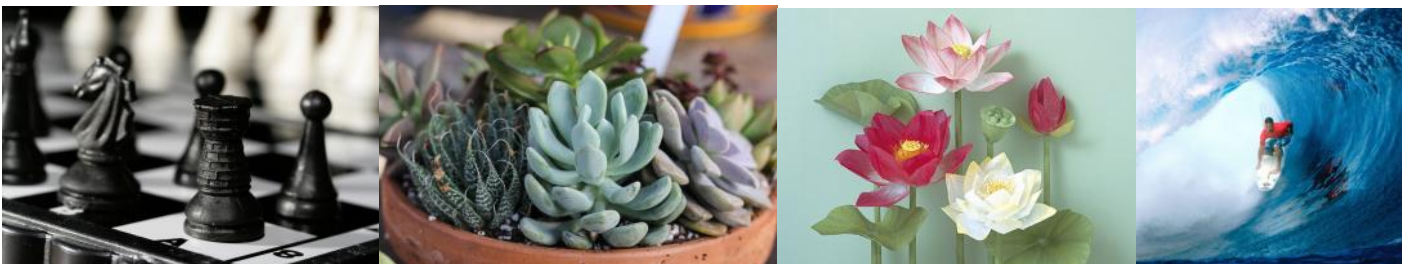
To finish off the exciting and productive year students have had at Woonona we conclude the year by offering a variety of "end of year activities".

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# Construction

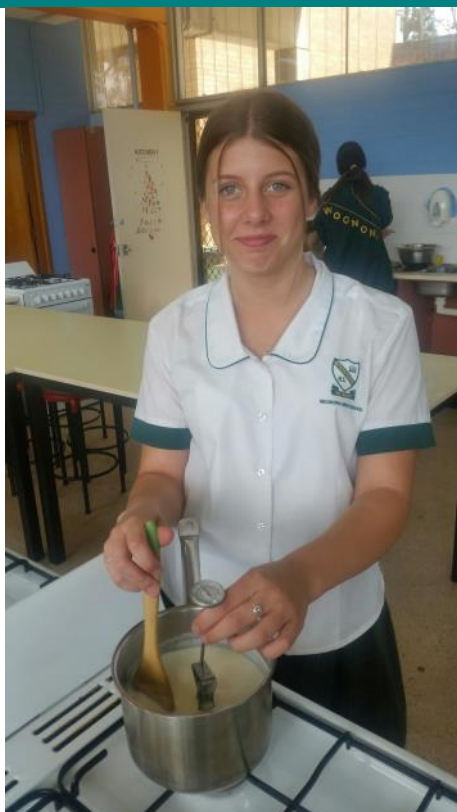
